

Kraków in the CAPITAL: 2016 World Youth Day Stateside

At the invitation of the Archdiocese of Washington, CRS was honored to co-sponsor Kraków in the Capital, a daylong pilgrimage hosted by several Mid-Atlantic dioceses and universities on July 30, 2016. It was attended by 1,300 young adult pilgrims from over 50 dioceses and it was the largest US celebration of World Youth Day to date! As an in-kind sponsor, CRS provided two inspirational catechesis talks in English and Spanish on the theme "Mercy Without Borders", an educational simulation about the plight of unaccompanied children from Central America, and global discipleship prayers and resource materials.

Dr. Maryann Cusimano Love, a world-renowned international politics professor from Catholic University of America, and **Mr. Andrés Arango**, president of the National Charismatic Renewal Movement and the head of Hispanic Ministry in the Diocese of Camden addressed the audience. They lifted up how our Church shares mercy based on their own experiences with CRS overseas and encouraged Catholic young adults to get involved with CRS here in the U.S.

CRS worked with CRS Student Ambassadors and other student leaders from Cabrini University, Villanova University and University of Maryland to provide a Refugees Seeking Safety Simulation experience for the

pilgrims, which was featured in a Catholic Standard article "Krakow in the Capital festival brings World Youth Day to Washington". This simulation was created by CRS Student Ambassadors at Cabrini University to educate participants on the issues facing refugees, especially unaccompanied minors, fleeing gang violence, domestic abuse and drug cartels in their home countries of Guatemala, Honduras and El Salvador.

CRS Student Ambassadors helped carry the cross during the evening Candlelight Stations of the Cross, which was captured in this World Youth Day in DC <u>recap video</u>.

Diocese of Charlotte CRS Diocesan Directors Host a Retreat for Faith Leaders in Social Ministry

As part of the CRS Capacity Building Initiative, on November 4th thirty parish social ministry leaders, representing both Hispanic and Anglo communities of the Charlotte diocese gathered in Maggie Valley, NC to continue their work of building a network for global and local social ministry in Western North Carolina. Hosted by CRS Diocesan Directors Joe Purello and CBI Animator Nick Haskell, the bilingual and bi-cultural parish leadership retreat focused on equipping folks to actively engage their communities in the pursuit of justice and the common good both globally and locally. Employing community organizing principles, attendees participated in training sessions that focused on 1 to 1 meetings and parish mapping to intentionally build capacity. They also experienced formation around Catholic Social Teaching principles, exploring theological reflections on "how the world should be" versus "how the world is." Deacon Robert Vigil, a CRS Global Fellow, guided the weekend with a truly gracious and pastoral presence. A highlight for Nick Haskell was being inspired by seeing "the bridge building and people willing to step outside of their comfort zones reaching across racial and cultural distinctions, and participants understand a new paradigm in parish social justice through relational engagement."
